

Instructional Coach

Primary Responsibilities

- Model the school's shared mission, core values, and the ASD Learning Principles.
- Establish rapport and maintain constructive interaction with teachers.
- Coach faculty in developing coherent practices by providing timely, relevant and contextual feedback and support for teachers.
- Demonstrate and model best practice in the areas of instruction and assessment.
- Maintain open communication with the leadership team.
- Co-plan, observe, and conference with teachers
- Provide necessary bridging between curriculum, instruction, and assessment as needed.
- Facilitate professional development workshops as needed.

Other

- Engage with the administration in a committed effort to improve one's own instructional skills
- Openly support and abide by all school policies and procedures
- Model the 'Core Values' in interactions with the school community
- Liaise with the Director of Learning, taking on tasks as assigned, including all school goals

Personal

- Demonstrate commitment to personal continuous professional growth and development
- Develop and maintain effective working relationships
- Represent ASD with students, parents, colleagues, and broader school community in a professional manner
- Exhibit a professional attitude toward criticism
- Recognize and strengthen personal performance through self analysis of actions, participating in professional development activities, exploring educational research, participating in professional organizations, and through formal renewal programs
